

What's an ASBA in Hospitality?

An Australian School-Based Apprenticeship (ASBA) in Hospitality allows ACT students aged 15 and over to begin a paid traineeship while still at school. You'll gain hands-on experience working in a real hospitality venue while working towards a nationally recognised Certificate III in Hospitality (SIT30622) and contribute to your ACT Senior Secondary Certificate

This is the ideal pathway if you're interested in front-of-house service, barista work, food and beverage operations, or guest service in a hotel or club setting.

What will I learn?

Through a blend of on-the-job training provided by your employer and online learning guided by a qualified assessor, you'll gain the knowledge and practical skills to thrive in the fast-paced hospitality industry.

You'll build experience in areas such as:

- Customer service and guest relations
- Food and beverage service
- Preparing and serving coffee and nonalcoholic beverages
- Operating point-of-sale (POS) systems
- Responsible service of alcohol (RSA)
- Workplace communication and teamwork Your trainer/assessor will stay in regular contact to ensure you're progressing, answer questions, and help keep you on track.

What's the Commitment?

ASBA students completing the SIT30622 Certificate III in Hospitality must commit to:

- 15 hours per week (on average, across school terms and holidays)
 - Minimum 12 hours of paid work per week
 - Minimum of 3 hours of structured training per week, delivered through a combination of assessor-guided online learning and practical activities integrated into your regular work shifts.
- Remaining enrolled in an ACT secondary school.

Your school, parents, employer, and our trainers will work with you to support this balance.





Course Duration

The SIT30622 Certificate III in Hospitality qualification can be completed entirely within the ASBA pathway, depending on your work availability and school schedule. If needed, you may transition to a part-time or full-time Australian Apprenticeship pathway after school to complete any remaining units.

The full qualification includes 15 units of competency (7 core and 8 electives). The actual duration will depend on your progress and any credit transfers from previous study.

Most students complete the qualification within 12–18 months, with a general expectation of one unit completed per month.
